

Command Master Chief

Master Chief Green was raised in Phoenix, Ariz. and enlisted in the Navy on July 31st, 2000 and reported to Recruit Training in Great Lakes, III.

Upon Completion of recruit training, he reported to Basic Enlisted Submarine School (BESS) in Groton, CT for training.

In August 2001 he reported to the USS CHEYENNE (SSN-773) in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. While onboard he completed two Western Pacific Deployments in the FIFTH and SEVENTH Fleets. His first Deployment was extended three months in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom. While onboard USS CHEYENNE she received two Battle Efficiency "E" awards and two Commander, Submarine Group SEVEN Red and Green Navigation "N" awards. During his tour he was advanced to Second and then First Class Petty Officer.



In July 2006 he reported to the Staff of Submarine Squadron ELEVEN in Point Loma, CA as the Operations Division Leading Petty Officer and later as the Assistant Navigator. During his tour at COMSUBRON ELEVEN he qualified Assistant Navigator onboard USS HAMPTON (SSN-767), and was certified ANAV at COMSUBRON ELEVEN.

In September of 2009 he reported to USS HAMPTON (SSN-767) in Point Loma, CA as the Assistant Navigator, and later took the duties as the Navigation Operations Enlisted Advisor as well. During his tour aboard HAMPTON he ensured the safe Navigation of the Ship as she deployed twice. Once to the 5th Fleet and once to the 7th Fleet. While onboard HAMPTON he qualified Chief of the Boat.

In February of 2014 he reported to the COMSUBPAC TRE Team, as the Assistant Navigator and assumed the duties of the COMSUB-PAC FORCE ANAV.

In January 2017 he reported to USS HAMPTON (SSN-767) and relieved as the Chief of the Boat, later he relived as COB on WARSHIP SCRANTON in January 2018. While assigned to the Iron Horse he deployed to the 7th Fleet.

In September 2019 he relieved as the Senior Enlisted Leader of Portsmouth Naval Shipyard Detachment San Diego in Point Loma, CA. In June 2020 he relieved as the SUBRON Eleven Command Master Chief.



September at Oceanview Captain Johnson—A Great Guest



We were very pleased to have CAPT Allen Johnson, USN, Director of COMTHIRDFLT's MOC and N3, speak to us at our September luncheon. He did a terrific job of answering, "What is a MOC and what does it do?" He explained the Maritime Operations Center as a concept that Third Fleet has recently adopted. It takes the C3F staff from being a maritime HQ that trains and certifies deploying forces, to one that coordinates maritime capabilities through a full range of military operations. This shift to a full campaign approach was necessitated by an emerging China and a rearming Russia, which increased the likelihood of facing major combatant operations in the Pacific. The MOC "Monitors, Assesses, Plans, Directs and Communicates" in conjunction with other MOCs worldwide to achieve C3F's expanded mission. CAPT Johnson concluded with words of praise for Submarine Force readiness and effectiveness ... applauding submarine crews for how hard they are working despite how heavily they are being tasked these days.
