The View from Millington

- Recruiting and Retention Challenges
 - Less propensity to serve
 - Fewer morally, physically and mentally qualified
 - Challenging economy
 - Blended retirement system impacts uncertain
- Maintaining Warfighting Advantage
 - Why do officers leave the submarine force?
 - The pay scale myth
 - "Soft" issues hard to address
- Women in Submarines Progress
 - Accessions increased to 80 per year
 - Retaining about the same rate as men
 - 27 officer integrated crews by end of 2022, 12 enlisted integrated crews by start of 2023
 - First female PXO starts the pipeline next month
