

Our program for Tuesday, 14 March 2023: RADM John "Mac" McLaughlin, USN (Ret.) President & CEO, USS Midway Museum


Please plan to join us at the Oceanview on Naval Base Point Loma (NBPL) for this in-person luncheon / forum.

Mac McLaughlin is President & Chief Executive Officer of the USS Midway Museum. He was hired as the Chief Operating Officer in December 2003, one month prior to the Midway's arrival in San Diego and has been the chief executive throughout the building of the Museum.

Prior to joining the Midway, Mac retired from the Navy as a Rear Admiral in August 2003. During his career as a Naval Aviator, he served as a Commanding Officer of a helicopter squadron and Naval Air Station. He served two tours of duty in the Pentagon on the Chief of Naval Operations Staff and served Flag tours as Commander, Naval Air Reserve Force and Naval Reserve Forces Command.

Mac is the former President of the Historic Naval Ships Association and the former Chair of the Naval Helicopter Association. He is a board member for the San Diego Port Tenants Association, and a member of the American Association of Museums and the California Association of Museums.

Mac graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1972 where he was an All-American and Captain of the track team. He holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Troy State University. He is married to the former Norah Anne Flynn of Chula Vista and they have two adult children, Kathleen and Stephen and six grandchildren.



CAPT Amy Bauernschmidt provided an engaging overview of her naval career, including her time in Naval Nuclear Power School and her subsequent assignment at Naval Reactors in Washington DC. She also described her experiences commanding the USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN-72) in the Western Pacific and in an international RIMPAC (Rim of the Pacific) exercise near Hawaii.





Bruce Renne thanked CAPT Bauernschmidt and presented her with a copy of Maritime Museum's publication "A Century of Submarines in San Diego" and an NSL Challenge Coin.



National Submarine Day


National Submarine Day, on 11 April 2023, honors the anniversary of the day the U.S. Navy acquired its first modern submarine, the Holland VI.

Designed by Irish-American inventor John Phillip Holland in 1896, the Holland VI was launched on 17 May 1897 at Navy Lt. Lewis Nixon's Crescent Shipyard in Elizabeth, New Jersey. It was deemed to be the world's first modern submarine, with a host of impressive features all in one vessel. The U.S. Navy later purchased the Holland VI for \$150,000 on 11 April 1900. At commissioning, the Navy renamed the submarine the USS Holland (SS-1). It was commanded by Lieutenant H.H. Caldwell.

It appears that Submarine Day originally was celebrated on 17 March, which marks the anniversary of the day in 1898 when John Phillip Holland first demonstrated the Holland VI, to the US Navy.

Wreck of the World War II Submarine USS Albacore (SS 218) Identified off the coast of Hokkaido, Japan

On 16 February 2023, the U.S. Navy announced that the Naval History and Heritage Command's (NHHC) Underwater Archaeology Branch (UAB), using information and imagery provided by Dr. Tamaki Ura, from the University of Tokyo, confirmed the identity of the USS Albacore, which was lost at sea 7 November 1944. USS Albacore conducted 11 war patrols and is credited with 10 confirmed enemy vessel sinkings.
