The guest speaker will be CDR Michael (Mike) Brown, USN, Commanding Officer, USS HAMPTON (SSN-767)

Commander Mike Brown, a native of Groton, NY, graduated from Norwich University in 2003 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering and graduated as a Gravely Scholar from the Navy War College in 2010 with a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

Sea tours included various Division Officer assignments on USS PITTSBURGH (SSN 720) from November 2004 to October 2007, Engineer and Weapons Officer on USS TUCSON (SSN 770) from April 2011 to May 2014, and Executive Officer on USS CHICAGO (SSN 721) from October 2016 to December 2018 during which he completed an Engineering Overhaul in Portsmouth, NH, two Western Pacific deployments out of Pearl Harbor, HI, and Western Pacific operations out of Apra Harbor, Guam.

Shore tours included assignments as Submarine Watch Officer and Special Operations Officer for CTF-69, the submarine component of Sixth Fleet in Naples, Italy, the Submarine Squadron 16 Weapons Officer and N7/8/9 in Kings Bay, GA, and a Strategic and Theater Planner at Joint Interagency Task Force West of INDOPACOM in Camp H. M. Smith, HI.

Commander Brown assumed command of the USS HAMPTON (SSN-767) in December 2021. He is authorized to wear the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal with Silver Star, Navy Achievement Medal with gold star, and various other unit and personal citations.



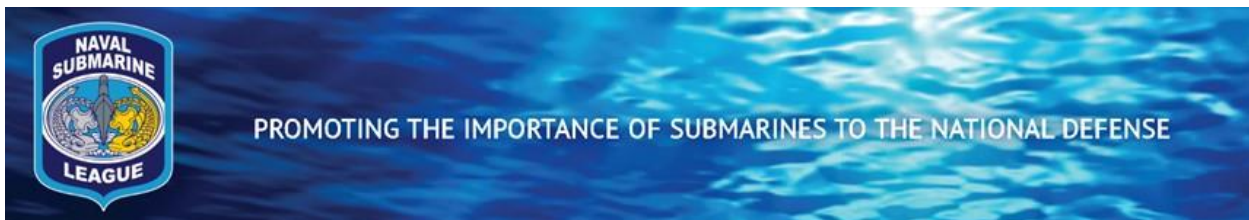
USS HAMPTON (SSN-767) departs Naval Base Point Loma for a Western Pacific deployment in June 2021. Source: COMSUBPAC

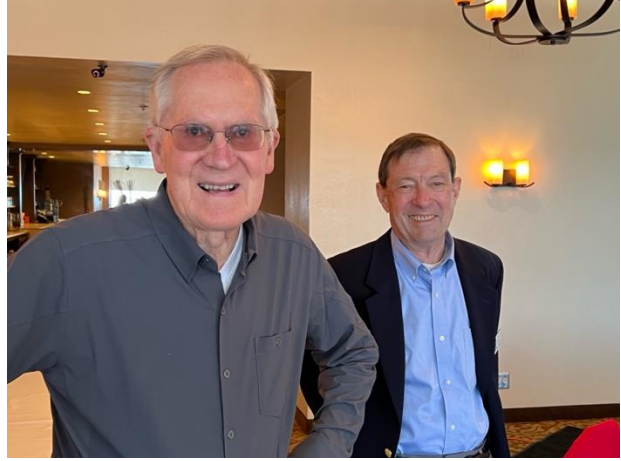

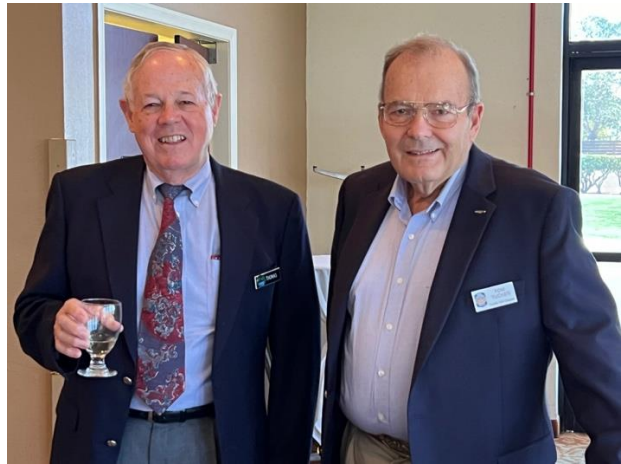

- COMSUBPAC Shore Sailor of the Year MMA1(SS) Jack Nemeth



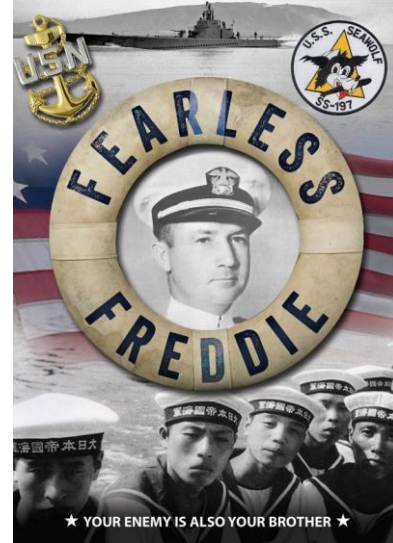

A 2020 documentary video entitled "*Fearless Freddy*" is available from various online retailers. The video is described as follows: "Rear Admiral Frederick Burdett Warder was known for both his bravery and his humility. Warder was Skipper of the USS Seawolf submarine during WWII. Then a Lieutenant Commander, Warder became known for his exploits during the battle of Corregidor in the Philippines in which the Seawolf sank several Japanese vessels and survived intense depth-charge attacks. For his efforts, the Commander was awarded the Navy Cross and ever after was known as "Fearless Freddie" (a nickname he disliked). A man who believed his enemy was also his brother, Warder ordered his crew to rescue enemy battle survivors from the sea even if they refused to come aboard."
