Our program for Tuesday, 11 June 2024: Commodore Ken Douglas, USN, Commander, Submarine Squadron 11

Please plan to join us from 11:15 AM to 1:00 PM at the Oceanview on Naval Base Point Loma (NBPL) for this in-person luncheon / professional forum.

CAPT Douglas hails from Long Island, NY and enlisted in the Navy in 1993. Following Nuclear Power training, he was selected for an appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy. He graduated with merit in 1998 with a major in Aerospace Engineering.

His afloat tours include the submarines USS MICHIGAN (SSGN-727), USS BREMERTON (SSN-698), USS CHEYENNE (SSN-773) and Executive Officer of USS ASHEVILLE (SSN-758). He commanded USS PASADENA (SSN 752) from July 2015 until October 2017, when the ship received the Submarine Squadron 11 Battle Efficiency award. He has completed six strategic deterrent patrols as well as several deployments to the Western Pacific and South America.

His assignments ashore have included an instructor tour at Tactical Training Group Pacific, Junior Board Member on the U.S. Fleet Forces Command Nuclear Propulsion Examining Board, Special Assistant to the Commander of United States Strategic Command, Deputy Commander of Submarine Squadron Eleven, and the Submarine Commanding Officer and Post-Commanding Officer detailer at Navy Personnel Command in Millington, TN.

CAPT Douglas is a graduate of the Air Command and Staff College and the Joint Forces Staff College. He holds a M.S. in Engineering Mechanics from Columbia University.

His personnel awards include the Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, and various campaign and unit awards.

CAPT Douglas assumed command of Submarine Squadron ELEVEN in May 2022.

CDR Brown acknowledged the long and distinguished history of the U.S. Submarine Service, which built the foundation for today's modern submarine fleet. He provided a brief synopsis of the recent, and extraordinary, operating cycle of the SubRon-11 Los Angeles-class attack submarine USS HAMPTON (SSN 767), which, under his command, operated in WESTPAC, off the west coast of South America with allied naval forces, and most recently in the Arctic Ocean, where HAMPTON surfaced at Ice Camp Whale, kicking off ICE CAMP 2024 in March.



FTCM(SS) Timothy Kearns narrated the Tolling of the Boats ceremony, calling out the name of each sub lost as COMSUBRON 11 Sailor of the Year ETN1(SS) Joseph Pierce tolled the bell one time for each of the 65 boats lost.

124th San Diego Submarine Birthday Ball, 4 May 2024



WITH A 5512 FORM ON FILE, YOU ARE REQUIRED TO STOP AT THE NBPL PASS & ID OFFICE AND PICK UP A ONE-TIME PASS EACH TIME YOU ENTER THE BASE. See Simone Reyes in the PASS & ID Office. Then show the ID at the base access gate.
